



From "MYTHOS" to "LOGOS":
Educational Approaches to European folk myths and legends

CITY GAME

Hi, today you will take part in a historic journey which will take place
in the center of Rzeszów.

For this game you need a group of 4-6 people a telephone with
a camera, internet connection and a good mood.

Take your time and pay attention to the details.

When you're ready, 'high-five' to your teacher and you may start.

First task, look around, choose any person that you can see,
approach and ask him or her in English:

What is the name of the President of Rzeszów?(name and surname)

Remember the answer or write it down.

If you have the answer look around and search for a HOTEL. Go to
the hotel and tell the receptionist who the president of Rzeszów is.
You will receive an envelope and you will find further instructions
inside. Remember there is one envelope to be picked up at one
place, the quicker you are the better.

Among you there is one student from Poland. He or she is your
advisor but can only answer **yes or no** questions.

Open google maps in your phone and put these coordinates

Follow directions to the place where the quiz starts.

The moment you reach that place you can start reading the document which is inside the envelope

***Welcome my friends to our beautiful RZESZÓW,
Today you will have a chance to learn about our local legends.***

First approach to the steps in front of you and you will see a painting, don't go down the steps!!!


The painting presents a 17th century map made by
K.H. _____ (1) (Find the surname of the author of the map).

This is the copy of the map painted to celebrate 650 years of Rzeszow. At the top, you will find a crest of Rzeszow. During today's walk you will have a chance to see it again and you will learn some more history of our city.

In the neighborhood called Staromieście next to the rivers: Przyrwa, Mikośka and Wisłok **Rzech** has built his house, he was also called Rzeszem. He was wealthy and hard-working man. His house was often envied by other city inhabitants.

Unfortunately, his house was often attacked and robbed but he was no loser he knew how to defend his house. He decided to build a wall and make a fosse with water all around his house and that way he created castle-town among the rivers.

It was called **RZESZÓW** and the name comes from his name **RZECH**.

Many years later  King Casimir the Great gave field to his servants as a way of thanking them for their services. One of the servants was Jan Pakoślawica who received the field between the rivers. He called himself '**Rzeszowski**' (meaning from RZESZÓW) and thanks to that the castle-town kept its original name.

Now it's time for you to go.....

Turn around, back to the map, go across pedestrian crossing, but be careful the traffic may be heavy, and you need to choose a proper crossing.

Decide which way you should turn to approach a beautiful giant tree

(2) (Write the name of the tree in Polish)

Rzech's wife used to prepare a lime tree tea, which was often used as medicine for cough and fever.

Go along the pavement. On the right you will see a Parish Office.

The building on the left is a Parish tower. (3) (take a photo of your team so that the tower can be seen)

Keep on walking on the right side.

I hope you can see a set of townhouses. On the closest to you, on the right you will see the name of the street which is on the blue board.

That is 3^{go} ----- (4) (write down the name in Polish) Street

Keep on walking..... while you are on this street look for a bronze man walking through the street with the guitar in his hand. A well-known musician from Rzeszów ----- (5) (write down his name and

surname and take the photo of a group jumping up all around the statue)

Now look around and find two white church towers and go towards them. One of them has a clock in the middle.

The street you are walking along was previously called: PIJARSKA, PAŃSKA and then PANIAGA.

Half way to the towers, look for GALERIA PANIAGA

You will see the way the street looked previously right opposite GALERIA PANIAGA, look through the glass in the pavement and you will see the true History.....

Keep on walking to the white towers.

Look at the church and its towers for exactly one minute, you will see two Roman knights guarding entrance (6) (the leader of the group takes a selfie with the one of the knights with both his eyes closed).

The church was also a shelter for citizens during enemy raids. The legend says that in the underground of the church monastic treasure is hidden. Not to be found till now.....

Keep on walking until you see lamp posts with double lights, follow them one by one they will lead you to the mansion with a scepter that can be seen up above other houses. This neo-renaissance mansion was built here a 100 years ago.

Look around and go towards a cobbled road. Lamp posts with double lamps will change into single. On the blue sign you will find the name of the street _____ (7) (write down the name of the street in Polish).

Jump to the other side of the road on one leg. Girls have to do it on the left leg and boys on the right leg, don't mix it, it's very important, then find a fire hydrant with an animal on it _____ (8) (write the Polish name of that animal and take a photo of at least one person touching it with his right hand).

Go on in the direction that the fish points with its head. Go straight, on the right there is a fence, when you reach the crossroads keep in mind the direction of the fish's head, turn the direction she suggests, into the _____ (9) (write the name in Polish) street.

On the right you will see beautiful and original buildings. Pay attention to the building with a torso of a Polish poet _____ (10) (write his name in Polish).

The next building is number 8, look for Roman digits and write them down A.D. _____ (11) (1891) and move on.

The next building is "Pod Sową" where you can find a fountain and solar clock, find a saying in Latin _____ (12) (meaning 'you see the hour, you don't know the hour').

Now turn around and the castle will be right in front of you. Go along the lamp posts with triple lamps. Go the opposite direction to what you came from.

The next owner of Rzeszów was MIKOŁAJ SPYTEK LIGEZA – he was generous and good magnate but as he had no residence, he has built the castle which you can see.

Keep on following the lamp posts and stop by the one with 4 lamps.

Rest for a moment, look around, can you see two birds that defend the castle? One of them is on the red background and the other is hanging from the very top of the building.

What bird is that _____ (13) *(find the Polish name of the bird, you can use the internet)* It is the emblem of Poland.

Go in the opposite direction to that the head of the bird is pointing, climb down 26 steps on the left you will see a corner tower. Touch the wall – the castle was built from that type of stone. Go along the pavement straight on and you will see the Castle Bridge in the distance, flanking towers will lead you, follow the pavement to the next flanking tower. After passing it turn left, then go **s**traight on, the left side you will have castle walls and on the right there is a monument of Fighting Poland and Multimedia Fountain.

You have reached the end of the journey.

It's time to guess the password of the game - chivalric symbol

It was given to the citizens of Rzeszów by **K**MITA after they defended the city with great courage.

Up to now the Cross Pattée on the blue background is the crest of the Rzeszów **C**ity.
